
















Plants: Parts of Plants

Aim: To identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants: roots, stem/trunk, leaves and flowers by labelling the parts of a plant. I can name the different parts of flowering plants and explain their jobs.	Success Criteria: I can name the different parts of a plant. I can explain the jobs that the different parts of a plant do.	Resources: Lesson Pack House plants Colouring pencils Scissors
	Key/New Words: Roots, stem, trunk, leaves, flowers, anchor, nutrients, transport, seeds, carbon dioxide, sunlight, absorb.	Preparation: Parts of a Plant Labelling Activity Sheet - 1 per child Parts of a Plant Pairs Cards Activity Sheet - 1 per group Differentiated Parts of a Plant Folding Leaflet Activity Sheet - 1 per child Parts of a Plant Word Mat - as required

Prior Learning: It would be helpful if children have encountered the names for the different parts of a plant.

Learning Sequence

	Plants! Show children a range of house plants. Ask children to discuss the different parts of the plants that they can see.	
	Parts of a Plant: Children work in pairs to complete the Parts of a Plant Labelling Activity Sheet , then compare their completed sheets to the one in the lesson presentation.	
	What Jobs Do They Do? Look at the pictures of the different parts of a plant and then discuss their functions using the Lesson Presentation .	
	What Can You Remember? Children work in pairs to share what they can remember about the functions of the different parts of plants.	
	Fun Facts: Children should complete the differentiated Parts of a Plant Folding Leaflet Activity Sheet . Can children clearly explain the function of the different parts of a plant? <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around;"> <div style="text-align: center;">  Children cut and stick the job descriptions under the correct part of the plant. </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  Children label each part and fill in the gaps of each job description. </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  Children label and write their own job description for each part. </div> </div>	
	Pairs Game: Groups play Pairs using the Parts of a Plant Pairs Cards to match the parts of a plant with their functions. Some children could use the Parts of a Plant Word Mat to support them.	

Taskit

Askit: Why not create a quiz for a friend or family member? Ask them questions about what each part of a plant is called and the jobs they do.

Modelit: Can you use art materials to create a model or collage of a plant, with labels for the different parts?

Danceit: Can you work with a partner or a group to create a dance to show the different parts of a plant? Think about the jobs of the different parts in your dance.
